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OUR HISTORY AND COMMUNITY

Founded in 1970, Brookwood School is an independent, college preparatory, non-sectarian, coeducational day school for students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12. The school's founders developed the mission statement that emphasizes the development of the whole child: academically, physically, spiritually, and socially.

Brookwood students represent communities located in seven Georgia counties and two counties in north Florida. Qualified applicants are admitted without regard to race, creed, color, gender, or national or ethnic origin. For the 2020-21 school year, the student population consists of 11.98% ethnic minorities. Historically, 100% of Brookwood students are accepted into colleges and universities.

HONOR CODE

Brookwood is a community that believes strongly in the concept of honor. Specifically, we do not tolerate lying, stealing or cheating. For all students at Brookwood the concept of personal honor is viewed as an essential cornerstone of a Brookwood education, and it applies to all of our actions. Students in Junior Kindergarten through twelfth grades show their commitment to this code by signing an honor pledge each fall. In the Upper School, the Honor Code is governed by the Honor Council, consisting of elected Upper Schools students and Faculty Advisors.

COVID-19 STATEMENT

Beginning in March 2020, Brookwood School moved to a completely virtual, online schedule. "Continuous Learning," with primarily synchronous instruction, continued through the end of the school year in May. Grading scales, testing requirements, and course offerings remained the same; AP students took AP exams. Brookwood's status as an Apple Distinguished School, where all students and faculty have school-issued and managed MacBooks, minimized learning disruptions. Brookwood returned to inperson, on-campus instruction in August 2020, with masks worn by all students and faculty and socially-distant classrooms.

ACCREDITATION

The school is accredited by and holds membership in the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS), as well as the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), Georgia Independent School Association (GISA), National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC), Southern Association for College Admission Counseling (SACAC), Association for College Counseling in Independent Schools (ACCIS), and The College Board.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT SCORES

For AP tests taken in Spring 2020, 83% of the scores were a 3 or higher. All students in AP courses are required to take the AP exam.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Brookwood offers 11 AP courses, but due to scheduling constraints, the largest number of AP courses taken by the school's strongest students is 5-6: one in 10th grade, two to three as juniors, and three as seniors. Brookwood AP classes meet for one and a half class periods each day. Brookwood has chosen to invest more time, effort, and resources in fewer AP courses to better serve its small school community.

GRADING

In keeping with the school's mission and as a reflection of the small size of the graduating class, Brookwood does not rank its Students. Brookwood calculates both a weighted and unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA) for all students. A student's GPA is calculated using all courses except for athletic conditioning and any non-academic arts. The weighted GPA is calculated as follows: +1 for AP.
