Dear GISC Community,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, we take great delight in sharing this Annual Report with you. At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year, we eagerly anticipated our 15th anniversary school year in 2023-2024. Our Board is composed of members who have been part of GISC for more than a decade as well as members those who have recently joined our community. This combination helps us remain grounded in the origins of the school while also looking toward a strategic future.

As such, we remain committed to our mission, focusing on student programs in the service of bilingualism, global citizenship, and international education. Thus, the Board authorized our school leadership to initiate the International Baccalaureate's Middle Years Program (MYP) for Grades 5-8, complementing our long-standing commitment to the IB's Primary Years Program (PYP). This decision will result in a consistent pedagogical approach from Preschool through Grade 8.

The Board also looked toward the future with its decision to apply for membership in the consortium of 140 German International Schools throughout the world. These schools are networked and enjoy the support of the Federal Republic of Germany, especially in terms of hiring personnel from Germany, international recognition, and financial support. We anticipate a final decision on this strategic initiative toward the conclusion of the 2023-2024 school year.

Ever since our move to our current campus at 1726 W Berteau in 2018, we have also focused on our responsibility to steward the continued improvement of our facilities. We have agreed on a five-year building improvement plan that includes the installation of a new roof, replacement of HVAC systems on the second and third floors, and security upgrades such as an internal public address system. The Board also celebrates, applauds, and thanks the GISC community for its philanthropic support of capital improvements such as the renovation and transformation of the back parking lot into an outdoor recreational area. Additionally, the Board also thanks the GISC community for its continued support of the GISC Annual Fund that helps pay for operational expenses.

It is on this note of progress that we thank the faculty and staff, our parent volunteers, and our donors for their continued commitment toward our school.






GISC | **OVERALL ENROLLMENT**

Year-in-Review: Preschool



German Language Acquisition

Throughout the school year, we taught students with profound German language skills as well as students with little to no German language skills in our three preschool groups. Thanks to an individualized and nurturing environment, all of our students reached a solid basis of German language acquisition by the end of the school year. Those students advancing to Kindergarten the following school year developed strong German language skills, which serve as a strong foundation for a successful transition.

Through daily circle time activities, our students learned a multitude of social-emotional skills and academic skills

such as numeracy and early literacy. By sharing stories, singing playing songs, instruments and games, as well as learning about our IB units, our students practiced and strengthened their German language skills. witnessed and supported our students becoming confident and brave in sharing their thoughts with the group and performing in front of others.

Community

Year-round. celebrated we many national and international events and holidays to foster open-mindedness and (inter)cultural awareness. We invited parents and guest speakers into our classrooms to enrich our curriculum and strengthen our sense of community and belonging. We had many celebrations: Halloween, Día de los Muertos,

Laternenfest, Thanksgiving, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Valentine's Day, Fasching/Karneval, Lunar New Year, Grandparents & Special Friends Day as well as our End-of-Year Potluck.



Project-Based Learning

Over the course of the school year, all our students engaged in reallife, sensory-rich, and engaging activities. We allowed our students to discover and become curious about the world around them. During our unit about life cycles, our students found a caterpillar on the playground and decided

to name it "Lisa," take it inside their classroom, and

eight whole months of waiting, the caterpillar finally emerged as a magnificent moth. Our students witnessed first-hand the process of metamorphosis and a life cycle and made meaningful connections. Field Trips to Lincoln Park Zoo and nature preserves further supported our students' curiosity about animals and nature.



Year-in-Review: Preschool

Pre-Kindergarten "Maxi" Program

In preschool, our oldest students, the "Maxis," worked hard to master the various skills that prepare them for entering Kindergarten. As part of their Kindergarten readiness journey, our Maxi students work with their teachers on two key units of study: "Zahlenland" (Land of Numbers) and "Wuppi's Adventurous Journey through Phonological Awareness." "Zahlenland" is a program for early childhood math education that offers a holistic approach to introducing mathematical concepts to children through fun activities.




and facilitates increased attention and concentration. "Wuppi" is a puppet character

our students engage with as they are learning. The materials encourage close listening in a playful way, sensitize our students to the structure of the German language, and prepare our students for written language acquisition that will begin in Kindergarten.

our beloved "Wuppi" graduation ceremony. A certificate and a small farewell gift were handed out to all Maxi students to celebrate this momentous occasion of their learning journey.

Year-in-Review: The Value of a GISC Education

Spotlight: GISC Learning in Action Outside the Classroom

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Program empowers our students with the skills to be reflective and confident self-learners who proactively look for challenges within and







outside of our curriculum. A great example of their skills in action is the History Fair coordinated by our English Teacher Mr. Rozic. Three of our 7th graders presented the project "On the Frontier of Indigenous Rights" at the Chicago History Fair. They explained how Native American artifacts have been carelessly unearthed and unjustly distributed to educational and cultural institutions, which often present these artifacts in an incomplete or inaccurate historical context. Our students then went on to represent GISC at the Illinois History Day competition and became finalists - an incredible accomplishment!

This endeavor is an excellent example of our students applying the skills and frameworks they learn inside the classroom to an independent project. Leveraging the IB Learner Profile to guide their effort, these students demonstrated their aptitude for many of the 10 IB Attributes that make up this profile, including being risktakers and principled inquirers who are open-minded thinkers as well as reflective and caring communicators.

Spotlight: Making the World a Better Place

Every year, our students in Grade 4 participate in our annual International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (IB PYP) Exhibition, which is the final project that concludes their Elementary School journey at GISC.

Students selected topics for indepth study and took actions to support positive change in our community. Thanks to the efforts of one group of students. GISC established a composting program at the school in partnership with



WasteNot, a local composting company. In the spirit of the IB, these students educated our community about composting, raised money to help fund the startup of this endeavor, and assumed responsibility for the ongoing success of this initiative at the school.

Spotlight: Opening the Door to New Opportunities

At the end of the 2022-2023 school year, we graduated a class of eight students in Grade 8, our largest graduating class to date, and we are pleased to report that all of them were able to move forward on a High School path of their choosing. Five of our students opted to attend our partner school, the Lycée Français de Chicago, one of our students gained admission to the prestigious CPS High School Jones College Prep, one of our students enrolled at the Indiana Boarding School La Lumiere, and one of our students continued his education at the Alexander von Humboldt German School in Mexico City.

When asked about the value of their education at GISC, and what they would take with them as their academic journey continues, they had insightful things to share, in particular, about the value of a bilingual education:

2023 Gala Paddle Raise Project:

A Campus Transformation



Thanks to the generosity of our donors during the 2023 Gala Paddle Raise, over the summer of 2023 we were able to transform an under-utilized area of our campus into a fully functional Outdoor Recreation Area. For years, our back parking lot area was both a neighborhood eyesore and a space that couldn't be fully leveraged by the school to benefit our community. With our community's support, we were able to fully renovate this area into a functional space with improved curb appeal by installing a sports court area for our students to use both for recreation and physical education classes; creating a permanent outdoor dining space allowing for flexible bike and off-street parking; and sprucing up the lot with a new fence and landscaping.

This project happened in phases between June and September 2023, and started with removing the chain-link fencing and the cracked asphalt. Once the asphalt was removed, we were able to make the subterranean plumbing repairs necessary to address before repaving the area. After these tasks were taken care of, we were able to install the new fencing to surround the outdoor space and proceed with putting down the new asphalt.







Once the asphalt went down, it needed a few weeks to weather before we could proceed with the next step of painting the sports court area and installing the all-weather outdoor picnic tables. We finished up by putting in new landscaping along the street fence to add a more environmentally friendly element to the campus and installing newer storage provide units that much-needed additional storage space for our school. In addition to these improvements, we were also able to provide ample bike parking, an amenity we are pleased to offer to better serve our community.

We would like to extend a thank you to our Director of Building Operations Stephen Waguespack, who led this project from start to finish and ensured

all deliverables were in place in time for the start of our 2023-2024 school year. And once again, we extend a sincere thank you to the generous donors who were instrumental in bringing this project to life.




