Introduction

Shawnigan's Five-Year Dinner is a cherished pre-graduation tradition each year, celebrating "lifers" who are completing a five-year Shawnigan Journey. Attendees, who all started in Grade 8, usually include a multitude of Prefects, Heads of House, sport captains, award winners, and colours recipients. It's no coincidence that Shawnigan "lifers" contribute so strongly to the School community.

Building a positive School culture starts in the earliest days of a student's Shawnigan experience, as we set out from Day One to inspire the best in each to create the best for all. The Shawnigan Journey is an intentional and progressive educational, social and emotional experience, and students that participate from the impressionable Grade 8 stage are positioned to gain the most from the experience.

It is for this reason that we have developed a nurturing program for our 12-14 year-old Grade 8 students, providing a supportive springboard into the wider Shawnigan community. Rather than being immersed in senior boarding houses right away, our Grade 8s begin their Shawnigan Journey in speciallydesigned Grade 8 Houses with their peers: Stanton for the girls and Levien for the boys. Each House is run by a caring team of dedicated staff, and these houses work in tandem to foster a safe co-ed grade culture characterized by close friendships that shape and support students' onward journey at Shawnigan.

The success of this approach has been so remarkable that a new co-educational Grade 8 boarding house, built with one wing for girls and one for boys, has become Shawnigan's top priority to fully harness the benefits of this valued program.



Nurturing Our Youngest Students

By creating a nurturing and supportive environment that is focused on the particular needs of our youngest students, we set Grade 8s up for success. Dedicated Grade 8 boarding houses have allowed us to achieve this in myriad ways, and parents and students, current and prospective, are thrilled.

- Co-ed classes the beginning of the five-year Shawnigan Journey
- Nurturing connection and relationships through team building games
- Nurturing an encouraging and supportive House atmosphere
- Nurturing life skills

The objective behind the Grade 8 program is twofold: to allow students to have a positive start at the School, surrounded by peers who are at the same stage socially, emotionally and academically, and to build and foster friendships that will stay with them as they split into the Grade 9-12 Houses after their first year. With a dedicated staff to nurture them as they adapt to life at the School, these students not only have more one-on-one attention due to smaller House sizes, they also have parental figures on-site to guide them in life skills, allowing for a gentler and broader learning experience.

An Innovative Design

The next phase in the evolution of the Grade 8 program is the construction of a new and pioneering co-educational boarding house, with one wing for girls and one for boys. These two wings will allow each cohort to enjoy its own single-gender space while also offering regular opportunities for co-educational social connections through shared programming and common rooms to develop life skills and foster cohesion and lifelong connections within the grade group.

Planned to accept its first cohort of students in Fall/Winter 2023, the new boarding house will be the first of its kind for this grade level in Canada. Every detail of the design has been informed by Shawnigan's 106 years of boarding history and customized to the particular needs of our youngest students.

Students who are lucky enough to experience this Shawnigan "first" will be part of a loving community where students from all walks of life will learn the Shawnigan values of Curiosity, Compassion, Community, and Courage.


Why Shawnigan?
