### **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

Conferences will be booked through Edsby. Each parent will receive an email from Edsby on Tuesday, Oct. 25 with instructions on how to book a time slot. Please <u>click here</u> if you need assistance with booking the conferences on Oct. 25. We kindly ask parents to book only one conference per teacher. In that conference, the teacher will discuss your child's progress in the multiple subjects they are taught. For example, while Ms. Scheepers may teach your daughter in both English and Technological Design, please only book one conference slot for both courses. Parents can also book a conference with their child's advisor as necessary.

If you cannot participate in the conference dates, you can always contact a teacher by email. Every class has continuous reporting via Edsby's "My Work," and teachers will always reply to provide information and guidance for your daughter.

#### **Pick-up Time Reminder**

As we settle into the school routine, parents are reminded that students must be picked up by 6:30 p.m. from the Cygnets Centre. For those involved in robotics on Tuesday evenings, student

pick-up is at 7 p.m. at the Cygnets Centre. There is no formal supervision provided after these times.
