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Founded in 1947, St. Andrew's Episcopal School is an independent, college preparatory school for students in pre-K3 through the twelfth grade. St. Andrew's is known for academic excellence, providing the academic emphasis and cultivating the critical thinking skills needed to excel. Valuing diversity, St. Andrew's welcomes students of any race, color, religion, nationality, or ethnic origin. Typically, 100 percent of St. Andrew's graduates attend four-year colleges and universities.

LOCATION

Students in pre-K3 through grade 4 attend classes on the St. Andrew's South Campus in Jackson, while students in grades 5-12 meet ten minutes away at the school's North Campus in Ridgeland.

The St. Andrew's community is grounded in trust and operates under this revered tradition. The St. Andrew's Honor Code ensures that students accept responsibility for their conduct and actions, and grants freedom based on trust. The student-run Honor Council investigates and adjudicates any violations of the honor code. It is composed of elected student representatives from each class, chaired by a Senior Honor Prefect, and monitored by a faculty advisor.

ENROLLMENT

1016 students in pre-K3 through grade 12; 300 students in the Upper School; 88 students in the Class of 2021.

SERVICE LEARNING

In its commitment to molding students of integrity and character, St. Andrew's requires students to contribute a minimum of 100 hours of volunteer service over the course of their high school careers. This total will be reduced for the class of 2021 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

FACULTY

The St. Andrew's Upper School faculty/staff is comprised of 45 individuals; 33 hold advanced degrees, including 6 with doctoral degrees.

FINANCIAL AID

For the 2020-2021 school year, St. Andrew's awarded more than \$3.3 million in financial aid. St. Andrew's is one of only 50 schools nationwide and the only school in Mississippi to receive a \$2 million Malone Family Foundation endowment to provide scholarships for academically gifted students with financial need.

NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS AND COMMENDED STUDENTS

In the classes of 2017-2021, 46 students were named National Merit Semifinalists and 16 were recognized as National Merit Commended Students, representing fifteen percent of the graduating classes.

COVID-19 STATEMENT

In the spring of 2020, St. Andrew's did not change its grading scale or offer any pass/fail options. The school made a decision to not allow fourth quarter grades to negatively impact a student's overall grade in a class. All students in AP courses were required, as in previous years, to take the corresponding AP exams. The 2020-2021 school year began under a hybrid model, with 62 students choosing to learn virtually exclusively for the first quarter. The remaining students attend school on campus every other day while learning virtually on alternate days.

ACADEMIC LIFE

Most students take six courses for credit per year; all Honors and AP courses require permission from teachers. One AP course is allowed for students in grade 10 and entrance is highly selective; 20% or fewer will take an AP course. Students in grade 10 also are limited to a maximum of three Honors courses unless granted permission from the Upper School Head. Students in grades 11 and 12 who wish to take more than three AP courses in either year must receive permission from the Upper School Head. Students Students may take a maximum of six courses unless the seventh course is taken through the Malone Schools Online Network or Global Online Academy. These courses are designated by MSON or GOA on the transcript.
